Comprehensive Therapeutic Assessment and Intervention Service

G-map can offer a comprehensive package of work to children and young people who display inappropriate and/or harmful sexual behaviour, together with their carers and support network, who reside in suitable placements within reasonable travel distance of Manchester.

Our core service will include:

- Each young person is allocated to a two-person G-map practitioner team. Each practitioner has a relevant professional qualification and extensive experience working with young people who display inappropriate and harmful sexual behaviour. G-map has a long-standing national reputation for providing this level of expertise and commitment. Co-working provides pro-social modelling, safety, treatment integrity, more accountability and less subjectivity, reliability of sessions, and continuity regardless of sickness absence or leave, all of which helps with young people's motivation and sense of safety.
- Attendance at an initial professionals' meeting to ensure key information is shared and roles and responsibilities clarified.
- Facilitating / attendance at two further professionals' meetings
- Weekly therapeutic sessions of up to one hour held at G-map offices or an affiliated residential care facility, with feedback provided to the relevant person(s).
- Regular handover with family / carers to ensure learning is transferred into the young person's daily environment with appropriate support. Not being a direct part of the young person's care system allows G-map practitioners to create a safe therapeutic relationship that does not compromise the young person's daily living relationships and experiences.
- Meeting with family / carers during first 20 weeks at our offices in Sale or online as appropriate.
- Psychometric testing and reports as part of a full evaluation of the young person's progress (see section on G-map's evaluation programme).
- Comprehensive Assessment and Intervention Report at 20 weeks including an appropriate AIM3 assessment as required. This also comprises a formulation regarding the child or young person's pathway to the sexual behaviour concerns, consideration of safety needs pertaining to them and others, and recommendations regarding placement and intervention needs.
- Update reports at three-monthly intervals following the comprehensive assessment period.
- Final report outlining the young person's progress; up-to-date assessment of risk using G-map's evaluation programme including further psychometric testing; review of AIM3 outcomes; and recommendations regarding future needs, and transition packages where required.
- G-map practitioners receive regular clinical supervision with G-map Service Managers who have considerable experience both as practitioners and supervisors within the field.



Additional services can be negotiated as part of the package in response to the individual needs of the case. These can include:

- Family sessions as relevant
- Attendance at professional meetings outside of those stipulated in our contract
- Training input to residential care teams
- Keep safe work with siblings where appropriate
